

Do vaccines cause allergies?

A number of studies have been completed on this question, and these studies have found no evidence that vaccines cause allergies.

Further research into this question is still being done; however, we already know that the benefits of immunization greatly outweigh the risk of developing an allergy.

It is important to talk to your healthcare provider about any allergies you or your children may have, before your child is immunized.

Your healthcare provider will recommend what is safe for your child, based on his or her medical history, including allergies.
